PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Mount Lawley SHS was accorded a grant for Asian Literacy in 2010, which is designed to improve the students' understanding of Asian cultures and societies. This will be developed through both formal and informal measures. Through participating in activities students of the school will no doubt develop an appreciation of Asia. Australia is, of course, closely connected to Asia through economic activity, tourism and shared cultural experiences.

Whilst not a formal component of the school's program, the visit of the Wengin Art Troupe from Zhejiang University presented students with the opportunity to enjoy a variety of performances within the concert. The troupe performed a number of times and all Middle School and Chinese Language students attended. They saw very polished performances from Zhejiang students, who, were Arts enthusiasts and not Arts students. The Mount Lawley SHS students enjoyed the performances and gained an understanding of the very broad cultural base of China. One of the performers was a graduate of our sister school, Hangzhou Number 14 Middle School.

Of course, we farewelled the visiting delegation from Hangzhou recently. They all enjoyed their home stay, Mount Lawley SHS experience and Western Australian adventure. Thanks to all of the families that hosted either a Hangzhou student or teacher. Your support of the school's languages program made this exchange possible. Thank you.

The Year 10 BBQ was well attended with 150 plus parents taking advantage of the opportunity to meet teachers. New parents to the school found the evening of value.

The BBQ is an initiative of the school's Year 10 Working Party, a group that is looking at ways to enhance programs for this cohort. Form teachers in Year 10 have a focus on checking diaries and reinforcing the good habits developed in Middle School. Year 10 students have been issued with a commercial diary at no charge as part of this measure to improve student planning, organisation and commitment to homework. Parents are asked to support the work of the Form teachers through checking diaries and reinforcing the messages about homework, study and maximum effort to achieve the best results possible.

I would like to thank the Music and Languages Support Committee members, who orchestrated the event, and the teachers of these learning areas for their enthusiasm to nurture the Mount Lawley SHS community.

The school's House swimming carnival was held on Thursday. It was a humid day and relatively uncomfortable for spectators. The attendance on the day was pleasing and the attitude and behaviour of students first rate. In fact, staff at the Terry Tyzack Aquatic Centre made positive comment on the manners and behaviour of students. Well done to all.

Thanks also to the parents who attended and very proudly supported and encouraged all students. The competition was fierce and races hotly contested. Congratulations to Forrest for winning (11 out of the last 12 years) and to the respective Year Champions and runners-up. Thanks to Mr Howard and his HPE team for managing the carnival and to all staff for their work on the day.

When the school was rebuilt air conditioning, in line with policy, was not installed. The classrooms in the school, as students will have reported to parents, are hot and uncomfortable during the summer. A group of Year 8 students, under the direction of Science teacher, Mr Hawke, are recording the temperature inside buildings and on most days the highest is mid to high thirties. This has been carried out at the suggestion of the P&C to assist in gaining an understanding of the conditions staff and students work under.

Last year, the P&C and the school agreed to air condition the school in order to improve the learning environment for students. At the start of 2010 the library and café were air conditioned to provide all students in the school with the opportunity to gain some relief from the heat. This was paid for by the school. For every dollar raised by the P&C, the school will commit a dollar.

The P&C is seeking donations from parents so that funds can be generated for the project. Donations will be paid into the school's tax deductible building fund so that tax deductions may be provided. Whilst the funds are paid to the school, all monies from parents or organisations are credited to the P&C for the purposes of the air conditioning project. There is a donation form in this Update.

Dear Parent

In the interests of keeping our community informed I would like to advise that a man with red hair and freckles, in a green car stopped a student near Ashfield Primary School and offered food for them to get into his car on Wednesday afternoon after school. I urge all students to take care when going to and from school, and to report anything suspicious to parents, school and the police - call 000 in an emergency or 1800 333 000 to reach Crime Stoppers.

Here are some simple suggestions to help your child stay safer:

- ☞ Always travel in company
- ☞ Walk on the right hand side of the road so you face oncoming traffic
- ☞ Wherever possible, leave space between yourself and the roadway
- ☞ Stay in areas that are well lit
- ☞ Stay in view - avoid going into areas that are hidden from view
(such as parkland bush or behind shopping centres) and plan trips to avoid such locations
- ☞ Be alert - earphones and headphones can reduce your awareness considerably
- ☞ If you have a mobile phone, have it turned on and ready to dial an emergency number
- ☞ If a passing car stops nearby never get too close
- ☞ Do not hesitate to run from a situation in which you feel at risk
- ☞ Provide this advice to brothers and sisters, especially if younger
- ☞ Report suspicious behaviour to parents, school and the police, noting number plates of cars and/or clothing or distinguishing features of individuals.
