The P&C also elected Mr John Cloake to represent the group on School Council and Mr Gary Cockroft to the Finance Committee. Thanks to all members who will discharge a duty this year, along with the P&C Parent Support Groups in Languages, SVAPA and Music.

The election to represent parents on School Council closes on Monday, 14 March 2011. Ballot papers should be returned to the front office. The next meeting of Council is the AGM and the annual open meeting. All are welcome to attend.

A letter has also been sent to parents advising of the 2011 survey. Parents have been requested to complete the survey. It is available on-line through your child's account or a paper copy can be completed. The survey seeks feedback on general issues, along with some specific Mount Lawley SHS information. This includes parent opinion on the school seeking to become an Independent Public School (IPS) and the Early Start program where Years 10/11 commence Years 11/12 early. With regard to Early Start, a detailed feedback sheet has also been sent. The intent is to use the feedback as part of the review into whether the initiative is continued.

Round 3 of the IPS initiative is now open and this school must decide whether to apply or not. There has been very good support for this in the past two years and we will look at results from the survey and general feedback to assist in determining a position. It is highly likely that there will be another public meeting conducted. Details will be provided shortly.

In 2010 a number of Year 9 students entered the Science and Engineering Challenge and won through to the State finals. The first set was held recently and Mount Lawley SHS was runner-up. There is still a chance to compete in the national final and this will depend on the scores of other runner-ups. Congratulations to them and Mr Payne for the excellent way that they applied themselves. The organisers were very impressed with their manners, behaviour and helpfulness. Feedback on the students was provided by the organiser:

"...good manners and kindness count for so much and it would be such a pleasure to teach them." and

"Please pass on to your kids that their good manners have left a great impression."

The students were a great credit to their families and Mount Lawley SHS. Well done.

The Commonwealth government's My School website has now been launched. This provides information on Year 9 NAPLAN results in details, financial data and a range of other information. The NAPLAN results show that Mount Lawley SHS performed very strongly in NAPLAN in 2010. In fact, the outcomes are very pleasing and show the school performing well, especially when compared to other high SEI schools.

The financial data, from 2009, shows an average school income of \$12,548 per student. This is not a clear cut statement of the amount of money available to conduct operations. This amount includes a school salary component as well as part of the costs of running Regional and Central office and the salary of their staff.

Additionally, as the school enrolls Aboriginal students and hosts a GATE program, the total State-wide costs of these programs are averaged and some of this amount is borne by Mount Lawley SHS in its My School allocation per average student.

The P&C has funded the establishment of a Homework Club. This operates on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons from 3:00pm to 4:00pm in the school library. The Homework Club is staffed by teachers from a variety of learning areas, however, as there are only several rostered at a time, it is not possible to provide all learning areas. Parents are encouraged to support the attendance of their students at the Homework Club. It is open for all students in Years 8 to 12. Students are welcome to attend to study for examinations and NAPLAN, to complete assignments or finish homework. The great support of the P&C is acknowledged. The P&C will assess the attendance and participation rates after 6 months to see if it will be continued. A copy of the Term 1 schedule is attached.

It is pleasing to advise parents that the school has been contracted to manage the Department's Follow the Dream Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander aspiration program. This is available for students in upper-school. Students in the program come from a wide variety of schools in the metropolitan area. It will also be extended to qualifying students at this school.

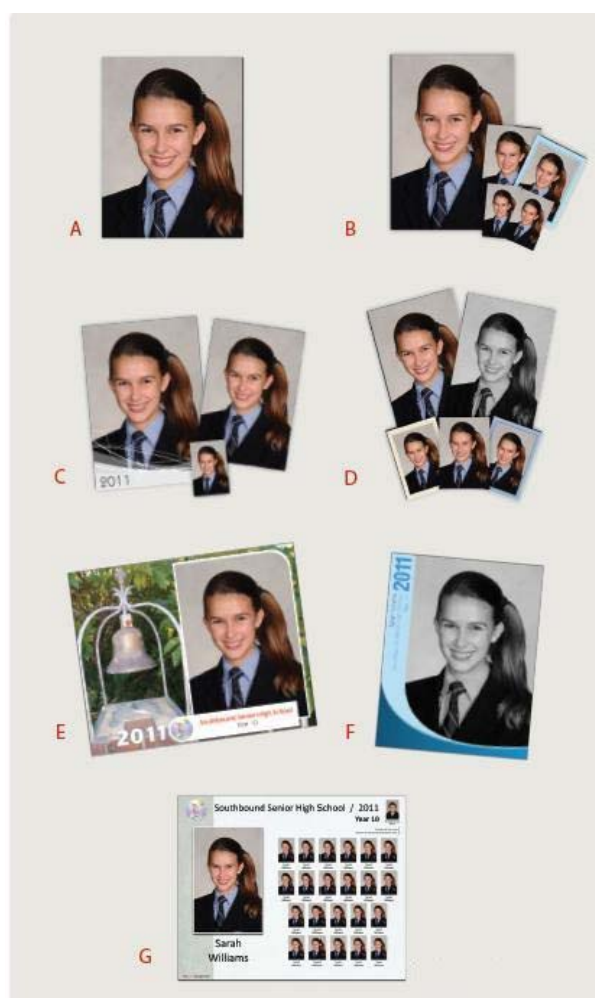
SCHOOL PHOTOS
