PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

The last P&C meeting also saw the opportunity for parents to discuss whether Mount Lawley Senior High School should seek Independent Public School (IPS) status. There was a lively discussion and parent questions could be answered. At the conclusion of the segment, parents attending voted 19-1 in favour of the school applying for IPS status. Thanks to those parents attending, including several attending just for the IPS discussion. Your support is appreciated.

Formal consultation with staff is scheduled shortly and this will also inform the decision by School Council. Council must support any application.

Parents also have the opportunity to provide feedback on the IPS issues, and other factors, through completing a survey. This will give staff a view of parent satisfaction. This can be done by asking your child to locate the school's website and then log on to the Moodle link. The "Community Survey" is on the top left of the screen under Site News. Click the link and the main window will change to give you access to the survey questions. The results of the survey will be reported to parents in the Annual School Report, which is scheduled to be completed by the end of this term.

The P&C has funded a Homework Club, which is being trialled this Semester. It operates two afternoons a week - Tuesday and Thursday. Students have the opportunity to ask questions and clarify doubtful points with the duty teachers. There is no charge to parents for the service. The P&C will consider the results of the trial at a future meeting.

This Update also contains an advertisement for an on-line tutoring program, iExel. This is a service that is West Australian based. It offers support for students in Year 11/12 Mathematics and Science courses. The service offers a free question service where a student may seek an answer through an on-line environment. A tutor will respond in a day or so. Face-to-face sessions are also available with the first 30 minute session free. Prices are available from the site. The manager has said a percentage of proceeds from Mount Lawley SHS students will be paid to the P&C.

Another site that students may find useful is www.khanacademy.org. This contains a large number of videos across, mainly again, mathematics and science.

Additionally, a traditional face-to-face service is also included in this Update. Academic Task Force offers holiday tutoring in a range of subjects. Parents may find this option useful to consider. Brochures, which include courses offered, prices and booking details are available from the school or website.

Mount Lawley Senior High School provided half of the funds to establish the Plumbing and Painting Trade Training Centre that has been established at John Forrest Secondary College. This was through the notional allocation attached to each school. The Centre provides an excellent start to any young person interested in these trades. There are seven Mount Lawley SHS students who started courses this year and attend on the days that the Career Link program allocates to work placement and TAFE. The Centre was opened by the Prime Minister, the Hon. Julia Gillard, MP. Also participating in the opening were Federal Minister for School Education, Early Childhood and Youth, the Hon. Peter Garrett, AM, MP and our local Federal member, the Hon. Stephen Smith, MP, Minister for Defence. Attending this program is recommended to any student interested in the plumbing and painting trades. There will be a presentation at the Year 10 to 11 Parent evening.

It is a requirement of the law that all young people must be in education, training or employment until the end of the year in which they turn 17. To those enrolled in school, attending school is compulsory. Parents have a responsibility to ensure their children attend school and to provide a legitimate reason if they do not. The school is seeking to improve its 2010 attendance record. To the end of March, attendance is as follows:

It is concerning that no year group is at 95% attendance, the level we are seeking to achieve. It is very concerning to see that Year 10 girls and Years 11/12 are all below 90%. Any student not achieving a 90% attendance record each term is at-risk of not achieving his/her best school results.

It is also concerning that there are a number of absences that are not accounted for by a reason. Parents are asked:

- To ensure children attend school.
- To provide a reason for an absence.

A reason may be provided through a letter/note, telephone call or personal contact with a staff member, email or text message. Parents may respond to the absence SMS message and this will suffice for an explanation. Parent support in this matter would be very much appreciated.

The Middle School assembly for Term 1 was held earlier this week. It was a well run event with the Years 8/9 Councillors managing the flow of activities well. A number of students received awards, including the Student of the Month.

It was pleasing to see two students, James De Lore (Year 8) and Jeremy Segal (Year 9) receive the accolade. The reason for their recognition was due to their honesty and citizenship. Each found a sum of money on the oval and handed it in to the office. The student who had lost it was extremely grateful for its return. The personal values of James and Jeremy are exemplary and they represent the very best of the qualities in young people.

It is also unfortunate that there are also other students who do not display the same positive values and engage in stealing. Students need to exercise due care with personal property. It is strongly recommended that items such as mobile telephones, stereos and such like should not be brought to school. If students do bring them and they are stolen, school staff can not be held responsible. Money, especially needs to be looked after. Physical Education and the changing rooms remain a problem

area and the P&C is assisting in looking at measures that may enhance security.

The Commonwealth government has a program where funds are provided to ensure that from Year 9 to Year 12 there is a one-to-one ratio of computers to students. Following an exhaustive consideration of how this can be implemented, the school is looking to issue each student from Year 9 a notebook computer. The computer is expected to be taken home and used for assignments and such and brought to school each day, charged, for use in class. Parents are asked to purchase a back-up hard drive and a case to hold the computer. This is expected to cost around \$100.00. There is no charge for the use of the notebook, which must be handed back to the school when the student leaves. The notebook is covered for insurance if it is stolen or damaged through fair wear and tear.

This is the last Update prior to the holiday period and the final week or so of school will see the annual POW ceremony and the School's ANZAC Day commemoration. Year 9 students will complete NAPLAN preparation as they will sit this suite of tests from the first Monday back at school.

A Day in the Life of an Astronomy Student

A day in the life of...

... an astronomy student is a great opportunity for you to discover what a typical day at university is like. The International Centre for Radio Astronomy Research (ICRAR) is offering WA secondary school students the chance to take part in a variety of hands-on activities that will be interactive, fun, and very rewarding.

What is Astronomy and Astrophysics?

Astronomy and Astrophysics is the study of the Universe and its physics – it covers everything outside the Earth. Astronomers work to understand how the Universe works, from stars and planets up to clusters of galaxies using instruments that view many different frequencies of light. Optical astronomers use telescopes like the Hubble Space Telescope to observe light from distant stars. Radio astronomers use telescopes like The Parkes Radio Telescope ('The Dish') to observe pulsars, black holes and the gas between the stars.

Activity program

Students will have the opportunity to:

- Observe a sun spot through a solar telescope
- Use a working radio telescope
- Hear about work at the International Centre for Radio Astronomy Research
- Learn about the world's largest radio telescope, the SKA, that might be built in WA
- Solve a space mystery using real radio astronomy data!

* Activities and program are subject to change but will remain within the confines of astronomy and astrophysics.

Morning tea will be provided on the day. Students are invited to bring their own lunch or buy it from one of the university cafés.

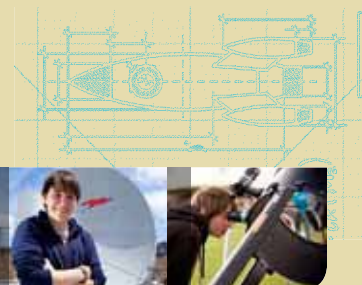

A Day in the Life of an Environmental Science Student

A day in the life of...

'A day in the life of an environmental science student' gives WA secondary school students the opportunity to find out what studies in this field would be like at UWA. Students will take part in a variety of workshops and demonstrations throughout the day that are designed to give them a feel for the vast array of opportunities that exist in environmental science.

Students will also find out more about the UWA campus and student lifestyle, as well as the career pathways available in this area through discussions with UWA staff and current students.

What is Environmental Science?

Environmental science is the study of the interactions between humans and the world around them, whether natural or human-made. Natural and human resources are interdependent and the use or misuse of one affects the other. Environmental science draws on a wide range of science-based disciplines such as biology, ecology, chemistry and earth sciences. Environmental science is also concerned with social issues such as environmental law and policy, climate change and natural resource management.

Activity program

Students will have the opportunity to have workshops in:

- The human impact on wetlands and water quality
- Coastal management – learn about the conflicts and how to resolve their issues
- The conservation of biodiversity
 - plants OR □ animals (please indicate which workshop you wish to attend)
- Marine science – discover how marine animals use their senses, including senses that humans do not have

* Activities and program are subject to change but will remain within the confines of the environmental science discipline. Students must wear closed-in footwear for all activities.

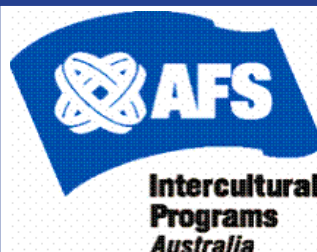
