- Courses of Study (WACE) Changes ... major topic of discussion, covering
 - WACE Requirements
 - Courses and Stages
 - Assessments and Grades
 - Examinations
 - English, and
 - Course reports
 - NB: Positive feedback to Terry on excellent presentation at "Year 10 Night"
 - NB: Noted that the counselling for Year 10s is going well, and that the school will have 300+ Year 11s next year.
- o Links to Hedland SHS:
 - Staff visits and (BHP funded) student tour
 - School of Mines Scholarship (\$10,000) available to Year 12 students
 - Intensive study program available 2nd week of July school holidays for Hedland students, where possible some MLSHS students can attend
- o Memorabilia: some 50th Anniversary Memorabilia still available
- o Future Developments: meeting scheduled for Terry and Christine (Richardson) to meet with Deputy Director General.

5.2 Treasurers

Balances (approx):

5.4 MLSHS Committees

5.4.1 Finance

Last meeting discussion centred around a potential re-budget due to some overspend (mostly temporary teaching staff) should "funding relief" not cover the full amount

Request for use of voluntary fees from the various areas totalled \$51,000, the \$17,000 available was allocated following discussion/prioritisation.

Several of the items remaining are excellent and do require investigating further. An opportunity for the P&C and/or other funding to be applied.

5.4.2 eLearning

Middle School laptop lease renewed, with a small increase in the number Upper School also has Notebooks available now

ACTION: Need to hold a ceremony to acknowledge the "Investing in School" grant

Will shift the meetings to Wednesday a.m.
