5 Reports

5.1 Principals

Terry presented a report, the following are the highlights ...

- Staffing: recent press has highlighted teacher shortage. MLSHS has avoided the issue, but it is likely some short-term vacancies may occur. Strategies are in place should this occur.
- Links to Hedland SHS: TEE revision courses were run with some MLSHS students attending with Hedland students. The academic and social mixing seems to have been very beneficial, and more interaction is planned (funded by BHP)
- o Demand for enrolment: increasing demand (including Years 10, 11 and 12) and it is likely that only "in boundary" students will be admitted.

5.2 Treasurers

Balances (approx):

- o General \$2,734, Term Deposit \$16,000 (approx)
- o Library \$3,239
- SVAPA \$32,072, Term Deposit \$5,000
- o Music \$15,461
- o Uniform \$18,561

Each committee is moving to standardised financial reports.

Uniform Shop – have good sales (~\$150k), stock sits at \$93k. Now looking at management of stock and funds required, eg carry 20% stock level with ramp up for busy times.
