5. Business Arising

5.1 Admin Support Position

Denise is getting on well and fits in as she has done work like this before. Working Mon 12:00-15:00 and Fri 08:30-12:00. Doing a great job particularly around SIM instruments and list attendance.

5.2 Music Soiree

Went well although poor attendance. Mainly due to flyers not being received.

Felt that only having 2 'events' was limiting and need to have more for the ambience and also to provide students a chance to perform.

Also felt that more teachers should have spoken. Just want more of everything.

5.3 Expenditure planning

5.3.1 Working with an accompanist

Great to work practice with an accompanist rather than wait to end of year when being assessed. Plan is to run some public 1:1 master-classes.

5.3.2 New piano

Looking to have piano available in each room, require a piano (example provided, cost \$6,995). After discussion agreed that:

- Music Dept to validate model of piano required
- Chris to pursue Finance Committee to secure 50% funding
- Hold over to next meeting with agreement in principle to fund 50%.

5.3.3 Students without lessons

Seeking funding support to cover 7 students without teacher for classes (\$40 for 30 minute session each week) or ensemble (\$60-\$80 per week). Costs may be shared with SVAPA. This generated a huge amount of discussion:

Need to get a better balance in the music program. Can not have so many Page 1 guitars. Is it a desire to play a style of music or a desire to play guitar.

- Need has arisen due to poor organisation.
- Why are we funding teachers?
- Why should fund-raising be directed to only 7 students.
- Chris needs to sort out coverage for the ensemble.
- Chris needs to make sure these students are catered for next year, and that there is no short-fall for next year's intake.

Motion (35): to fund up to \$1,500 to cover 30 weeks of lessons.

5.3.4 Electric Guitar

Seeking funding to purchase an electric guitar (\$359).

Update for Mt Lawley Music Parent Support Group

Lawley Art Auction Saturday 14 June 2014

11th year of Art Auction, a total of 928 artworks have been offered for sale with 701 (76%) being sold. The total value of the sales is \$390,000. This has pumped over \$166,000 into the Music and Arts.

- The cleaners who will attend to English dept early on auction weekend and leave their trolley so we can leave the area as we find it.

- Media department regarding showcasing some of the students work on auction night.

We are tracking well against timeline – that has been handed down from previous auction committees.

We are currently upgrading our website www.lawleyevents.com and preparing the mailchimp for emailing letters to artists. We are going to an online system this year. Thank you for going 50/50 with SVAPA to fund this.

Once the website is live we will announce in newsletter and encourage all music and SVAPA families to subscribe.

I have spoken at the music soiree and the SVAPA intro night to parents, we have some new blood and interest show. I have also introduced myself to our new Principal and feel confident that we can count on the continued support of the school admin area.
